Understanding Jesus: What Does Jesus Want with You?

"What do you want with me, Jesus?" Have you ever asked this question of Jesus? Maybe it's a question you are asking now. In Luke 8:22 Jesus made it clear that he wanted to go to the other side of the lake. Though it wasn't stated there, it becomes clear that there was something He wanted to do on the other side of the lake. Rather, there was SOMEONE for whom he wanted to do something. What Jesus wanted with this person was to bring life transforming salvation. In this encounter, we continue to gain more understanding of who Jesus is and what He wants with us. May we be fully open to all of it!

5. What are some of the "great things" that this man would likely have shared with his fellow townspeople regarding what Jesus did for him?

6. How do the people who live in this area respond to Jesus?	Why?
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7. We have been commanded to be witnesses of Jesus (Acts 1:8). In other words, like the man we have been called to speak of the great things Jesus has done for us. As you think about the idea of describing what great things God has done for you (v. 39), what are some stories that you could tell to the people in your life who might not yet know Jesus?

- Pick one person that you know that does believe in Jesus, and commit to praying for them for 5 minutes a day each day next week. Write that person's name down somewhere.
- Spend some time reflecting on one story of when you felt connected to God in some way. Review that story in your mind and your heart to be sure you are ready to share it with someone else.
- Go and tell someone what God has done for you. Be bold. Pick one person this week and simply share something you love about God. You might be surprised how interested they are to hear it, and what impact it might make on their own journey with Christ.

Daily Devotion: Return to this passage several times this week and continue to meditate on what it reveals about Jesus.
