Introduction: In 1 Corinthians 8, Paul addresses yet another question posed to him by the Corinthians ("Now concerning things sacrificed to idols."). At first glance, this issue seems far removed from our own circumstances. Unless we live in a place like India ware not often confronted with the issue of meat sacrificed to idols. But in addressing the presenting issue in the Corinthian's situation, Paul communicates principles that are relevant for us today in our own "Is it okay for a Christian to" situations. Hopefully this study will help each of us live out these principles more consistently in our lives.
