Hebrews 13:1-6

As we come to Hebrews 13, the author begins to give a number of commands in a kind of rapid-fire approach. These commands are not just good moral instructions tacked on to the end of the book of Hebrews, however; they actually flow out of everything we've seen in the book of Hebrews. In other words, these commands flow out of the Gospel. Though these commands are demanding for us, they are good news because they reflect the good character of God and they reflect what God is doing in Christ in the new covenant in our lives.
