## **Righteousness Based on Faith**

Most of us like to earn the things that are given to us. It's sort of the American way, right? We earn a degree. We earn a place on the team. We earn a paycheck. We earn a promotion. Sometimes we can tend to think that it must work this way in the spiritual realm as well. For the Jews of Paul's day, they tended to think about their standing with God in this way and as a result they were seeking to establish a righteousness based on their works (Romans 10:3). But in the passage we are considering today, Paul makes it clear (once again) that righteousness is based on faith.

But to appropriate what Jesus did for you requires that you respond in faith — a believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead and you confess with your mouth t Jesus is Lord. Attending church won't give you this. Living a good, moral life won't. Just apply knowing things about the Bible and God and Jesus won't. You have to believe. Obtain-righteousness requires a response of faith.
