Sermon Date: Feb 4, 2018

A Community of Love

When we believed in Jesus, the life-transforming presence of God came to dwell within us. And one of the things that the life of God in us produces is the ability to love. We are called to love. And we CAN love because of God's work in us! As we come to our passage today, Peter will focus on our relationships with our brothers and sisters in the family of God and he will make it clear that we are called to love one another. We are called to be a community of love.

Read 1 Peter 1:22-2:3

Brian said:

A lot of times when we think about biblical love we stress that it is a matter of actions not emotions, right? We should just decide to do what's loving regardless of how we feel. And this IS important because if we always wait to do what is loving until we feel like it, we'd never get there in some cases. But Peter is commanding more than acts of love. He is commanding that love should also be our desire. Our love is to be *sincere*, which means a genuine, unfeigned love. We are to love earnestly from a pure heart. God wants us to have a kind of love that wells up from genuine care and compassion. God doesn't want us to just do loving things; He wants us to be loving people.

7.	If you lack longing/desire for the Word or for anything from God that spiritually nourishes you, what can you do? How might verse 3 relate to having a longing for pure spiritual milk?
